CHANGES TO SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

As class dojo has been a fantastic way of engaging with families over the recent months, we have reevaluated the way we share information with parents so that you only have to visit one place for school communication.

We no longer have the facility to send bulk emails to parents and therefore we **will now be using Class Dojo as our main way of sharing school communication.** Messages and updates will be shared on the class story page. All letters will now be sent to you via Class Dojo too (we have printed a copy of this newsletter off for you today so that you see this important message!). **Please ensure you have the notifications switched on so that you don't miss key communication.** You can set the notifications so that they only come on at certain times and on certain days if you wish.

READING PLUS - KEY STAGE 2

As you know, we have made a huge investment in the Reading Plus scheme in KS2. Children can use Reading Plus at home and in school. The scheme is designed to encourage our children to have a life long love for reading. Foxes Class and Squirrel Class have been using the programme since we returned after the end of term holiday and are really enjoying the diverse range of material available to them. We have asked Ian, the Reading Plus consultant, to put together a short film explaining the programme in more detail; helping you support your child at home.
